- I. Being good enough is good enough!
"⁴Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord." Ephesians 6:4

- II. Enjoy the moment, not just the outcome.
"²² A cheerful heart is good medicine...." Proverbs 17:22

- III. Celebrate the teachable moments!
"⁷Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up." Deut. 6:7

- IV. The love of Jesus is the most important thing in life.
"⁵I have been reminded of your sincere faith, which first lived in your grandmother Lois and in your mother Eunice and, I am persuaded, now lives in you also." 2Tim 1:5

- V. Affirm the parent's authority
"^dChildren, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right." Eph. 6:1
